# **News from the Office**

#### **Student Code of Conduct**

As required, students reviewed the Parkland School Division and Copperhaven School Code of Conduct on their first day of school with their homeroom teacher. For parent information, the Code of Conduct can be found on the Copperhaven School website, under 'For Students'.

# **Morning Arrival**

Supervision begins daily at 8:45. There is no adult supervision of students or access to the school prior to that time. Please make a plan with your child/ren to arrive no earlier than 8:45. School starts with attendance and the anthem at 9:00 a.m. so there is lots of time for students to come in and get settled.

#### **Play Parkland**

Students in grades 3-6 will be participating in Play Parkland this year. Play Parkland takes place at the Tri-Leisure Center with students participating in a variety of activities to foster physical literacy--skating, swimming, gymnastics and land activities--over the course of six sessions. The program fee is \$57.50 per student in grades 3-6, added to PowerSchool accounts which helps cover the cost of bussing, program personnel and space. Teachers will be providing schedules and additional information nearer to the session dates.

#### **Grade 7-9 Alberta Health Services Covid Immunization Clinic**


On August 13, 2021, the Government of Alberta announced a COVID-19 school immunization program to further increase accessibility to COVID-19 vaccines. Our school has been selected for one of these AHS vaccination clinics for eligible students in grades 7-9 on the afternoon of Sept. 17. Information was emailed to parents/guardians on August 31 in the event that you want your grade 7, 8 or 9 child(ren) to receive this **COMPLETELY VOLUNTARY** service. Consent forms must be completed and returned to the school. Forms were sent as an attachment with the August 31 email or a paper copy can be picked up at the school office.

### **Traffic, Parking and Tips**

Parking, traffic flow and accessibility to Copperhaven School is a challenge. The school was built by Alberta Infrastructure and once completed became the property of Parkland School Division. As such, please understand that the staff of Copperhaven School is not responsible for the shape, size or access to the school and pick up zone. We also cannot fix it and feel really bad when you direct your frustration at us. We respectfully ask that you attend to the following:

- 1. Please do not swear or verbally harass the staff of Copperhaven School. We are in the difficult position of doing our best to make a tough set up work as best we can.
- 2. Please bring patience and be a positive role model for your children.
- 3. Consider drop off and pick up at the back of the school, accessed by entering via the Copperhaven neighborhood sign.
- 4. If possible, use active transportation to arrive at the school--walk, run, bike, scooter.

- 5. Establish a waiting spot for your child/ren, let them know they need to wait until you arrive at the meeting spot and then can safely move to your vehicle. Most times parking spots along the permitted parking areas will have opened up by that time. Kindergarten teachers wait with all of their students until they see parents arrive. Staff are happy to help parents connect with their children.
- 6. At the end of the newsletter you will find a map of traffic flow in our parking lot. There is signage that indicates No Parking which means drivers must stay in the vehicle. As in any situation, leaving the driver's seat when double parked or in the driving lane is not permitted.
- 7. For parents wanting to advocate for improvement
  - call law enforcement to report vehicles not abiding by the traffic laws and ask for their assistance on site, and/or
  - speak to the City of Spruce Grove about improvements to make the road situation better suited to the high traffic flow of two large schools (Copperhaven and St. Peter Apostle).



# **Volleyball Tryouts**

Extracurricular team sports are here! Volleyball tryouts have begun for senior volleyball teams for Grade 8 and 9 students. Grade 7 and 8 tryouts will follow for junior volleyball teams. Announcements are made at school well in advance of the day with tryouts running after school from 3:45 - 5:00 p.m. Tryouts are closed events so no spectators are in the building. League games begin the 3rd week of school with information to be shared regarding guidelines around spectators. Fees will be announced and collected prior to uniform distribution. Information about tournaments and games will be coming to players from coaches once teams have been created. We are looking forward to games being played in our gym very soon!

#### **CLASSROOM MUSIC**

Music has returned to the music room! Grades 2-6 students will be singing, moving and playing instruments once again, with appropriate risk mitigation strategies in place. There is even a class set of new ukuleles to try out! Grade 4-6 students will also be playing recorder after Thanksgiving. If you don't already have a recorder you can purchase a soprano recorder from the school for \$10.00, you can find this optional fee in powerschool.

#### **CHOIRS**

Junior (gr 2&3) and Senior (gr 4-6) choirs will hopefully begin lunchtime rehearsals in January.

#### **BANDS**
