#### **News from the Office**

# **Morning Arrival**

Supervision begins daily at 8:45. There is no adult supervision of students or access to the school prior to that time. Please make a plan with your child/ren to arrive no earlier than 8:45. School starts with a morning bell at 8:55 a.m. so there is plenty of time for students to come in and get settled.

#### **Play Parkland**

Students in grades 3-6 will be participating in Play Parkland this year. Play Parkland takes place at the Tri-Leisure Centre with students participating in a variety of activities to foster physical literacy--skating, swimming, gymnastics and land activities--over the course of six sessions. The program fee is \$57.50 per student in grades 3-6, added to PowerSchool accounts, which helps cover the cost of bussing, program personnel and space. Teachers will be providing schedules and additional information nearer to the session dates.

# **Volunteering at Copperhaven School**

We look forward to welcoming volunteers into the school to help enhance school programming. Once teachers and support staff get the first week of school underway there may be opportunities for volunteer assistance in the classroom or school. Calls for classroom volunteers will go out from teachers. Additional calls for volunteers may come from the librarian or other areas of the school on an as needed basis.

All volunteers, in accordance with PSD Administrative Procedure 316 shall be approved by the Principal. The volunteer approval process by the Principal shall include:

- Ensuring that volunteers complete a volunteer registration form
- Ensuring that a current Criminal Record Check is on file at the school for volunteers, at the determination of the Principal

#### **Volleyball Tryouts**

Extracurricular team sports are here! Volleyball tryouts have begun for senior and junior A volleyball teams for students in grades 7-9.

Tryouts are closed events so spectators are not permitted to attend. As soon as games start, we invite you to come and cheer on our teams! Information on fees, games, tournaments and uniform deposits will be distributed to players once teams are established.

#### **Severe Allergies**

Copperhaven is a "Nut Aware" school. This means we ask families to choose nut free alternatives whenever possible to help all of our students be safe. Our school has a number of students with nut allergies that can result in a severe allergic reaction should they be exposed to nut products. We thank you in advance for your attention to student safety.

#### **Music Notes**

We are looking forward to providing our students with some wonderful music opportunities this year. Please note the following:

- Grade 4-6 students will start playing the recorder after Thanksgiving. If students do not already have a soprano recorder, one can be purchased from the school for \$10.00-optional fee attached to Power School accounts
- Copperhaven Chorus for students in grade 7-9 will begin on Tuesday September 13 at lunch recess with a first performance already planned for Remembrance Day.
- Ukulele Club, for students in grades 6-9 interested in playing the ukulele are invited to drop in for some strumming fun on Tuesdays from 4:00-5:00 starting September 27
- Beginning Band is for students in grades 6-9 interested in learning how to play a wind instrument in a group setting. Beginning Band will start Wednesday October 5 from 4:00-5:00 and has a fee of \$25
- Concert Band is for students who already know how to play a band instrument and want to learn more. Concert Band will start Thursday September 8 from 4:00-5:00 p.m. and has a fee of \$25

### **Directed Learning Room-DLR**

Copperhaven School runs a Directed Learning Room as a strategy for helping our grade 7, 8 and 9 students achieve their academic potential. The Directed Learning Room (DLR) is a space assigned to students by Copperhaven teachers--a quiet place to do school homework in order to prevent students from falling behind. Occurring days 1 through 4 during the 11:50-12:20 break the DLR room is an assigned work block, supervised by teachers where students are expected to work independently on their assigned work.

Parents/guardians of students who are to be assigned to DLR will be aware in advance of any challenges with work completion. If a grade 9 student is assigned to the Directed Learning Room to complete missing assignments, off-site lunch privileges will be temporarily suspended.

#### **Covid Update**

Copperhaven School and Parkland School Division are excited that the World is Opening Back Up. 2022-2023 should finally start to feel like what a school year is supposed to feel like. While the pandemic is officially over, our new reality is that COVID-19 is here to stay.

With that being said, there are many measures that were previously implemented that just make sense to continue. Above all, we encourage anyone who is feeling ill to stay home from school. If you are exhibiting any of the key symptoms known for <a href="COVID-19">COVID-19</a>, we encourage you to access one of the many test kits that are also available at the school. Meanwhile, PSD will continue the following:

- Hand sanitizer will still be available at all schools,
- Students will continue to be reminded of the importance of thorough hand-washing hygiene.
- Eating areas will be wiped before and after lunch breaks.

- The frequency at which air filters are changed in PSD has also been increased and air handling/ventilation equipment in all schools has been adjusted to maximize the number of air exchanges within the schools. All schools will operate filtration systems that meet or exceed the Minimum Efficiency Reporting Values (MERV) 13 air filtration rate,
- Assigned entrances and exits will continue to be used to efficiently reduce crowding during high traffic times of the day.



#### **Traffic, Parking and Tips**

Parking, traffic flow and accessibility to Copperhaven School is a challenge. The school was built by Alberta Infrastructure and once completed became the property of Parkland School Division. As such, please understand that the staff of Copperhaven School is not responsible for the shape, size or access to the school and pick up zone. We also cannot fix it and feel really bad when you direct your frustration at us. We respectfully ask that you attend to the following:

- 1. Please bring patience and be a positive role model for your children.
- 2. Consider drop off and pick up at the back of the school, accessed by entering via the Copperhaven neighborhood sign.
- 3. If possible, use active transportation to arrive at the school--walk, run, bike, scooter.
- 4. Establish a waiting spot for your child/ren, let them know they need to wait until you arrive at the meeting spot and then can safely move to your vehicle. Most times parking spots along the permitted parking areas will have opened up by that time. Kindergarten teachers wait with all of their students until they see parents arrive. Staff are happy to help parents connect with their children.

5. Below is a map of traffic flow in our parking lot. There is signage that indicates No Parking, which means drivers must stay in the vehicle. As in any situation, leaving the driver's seat when double parked or in the driving lane is not permitted.
